(2) The Director shall take appropriate actions to ensure that special efforts are made to publicize the programs established in parts A, B, and C, in order to facilitate recruitment efforts, to encourage greater participation of volunteers of all ages and back grounds, living in urban or rural communities, and to emphasize the value of volunteering to the health and well-being of volunteers and the communities of such volunteers. Such actions shall include informing recipients of grants and contracts under this title of all informational materials available from the Director.

(3) From funds appropriated under section 502, the Director shall expend not less than \$375,000 in each fiscal year to carry out paragraph (2).

This authority funds two Federal salaries totaling approximately \$10,550 per pay period including benefits. Considering CR#1 will cover approximately 9 pay periods, the request totals \$100,000 which includes a 1% pay increase in CY 2026.

Under the Act, Congress expressly authorized the Corporation to award grants not only to State Commissions but also directly to eligible entities through national competition, including Congress's intent that a portion of program funds be awarded on a competitive basis to support trade skills, regional, and innovative service models. This competitive component is a core element of the statutory design and is implemented through the Corporation's regulations, which govern eligibility and procedures for competitive awards. Accordingly, the national competitive grant process is not discretionary but is an integral part of the program structure established by Congress.

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Description		The Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) is authorized under Title II of the Domestic Volunteer Service Act of 1973, as amended by the Serve America Act. The Serve America Act expressly amended Senior Corps authorities to introduce and require a competitive grant process for RSVP. Congress directed the Corporation to implement competition for RSVP awards, which was effectuated through formal rulemaking. Since enactment, RSVP has operated under a competitive, multi-year grant cycle, and Congress has consistently appropriated funds with full knowledge of and acquiescence in this competitive structure. Accordingly, competition for RSVP awards is not discretionary but is required by statute and implementing regulations.	The Serve America Act requires that RSVP awards be made through a competitive process. Accordingly, RSVP operates on a continuous competitive cycle. Under this structure, Year 1 awards are made through competition and are treated as new awards. Grantees are offered a Year 2 and Year 3 continuation under their Year 1 competition award. Consistent with the Serve America Act, grantees may subsequently be offered an additional three-year cycle through a renewal process, continuing the established competitive pattern. Year 2 and 3 continuation applications have been submitted but awards are pending release of funds after CR.
