 - Low Income Energy Assistance Program primarily provides home heating and cooling assistance to low-income households. Funding is used to provide assistance to support costs associated with home energy bills, energy crises, and weatherization and energy-related minor home repairs.
 - Planned use and allocation of funds, including all allocations referenced in the agency Operating Plan and statutory set-asides;
 - The vast majority of funding for this account is provided via formula block grants to states, tribes, and territories.

- The preliminary from an unreleased congressional report containing FY 2023 Program Data shows an estimated 5.5 million households received assistance with heating costs, approximately 927,000 households received cooling assistance, and 60,818 households received weatherization assistance funded by federal LIHEAP dollars. Households that received heating assistance had a median income at 81.6 percent of the HHS Poverty Guidelines.
